They can be in the form of

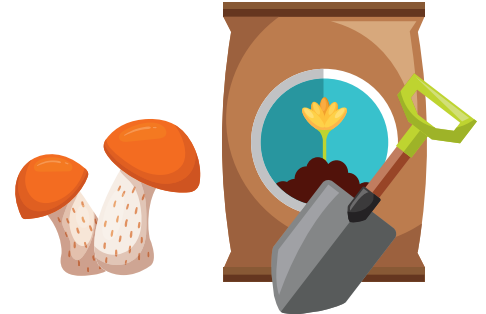
LIQUIDS,

The mushrooms that grow outside are different from the ones we buy at the grocery store. Don't eat mushrooms you see outside.



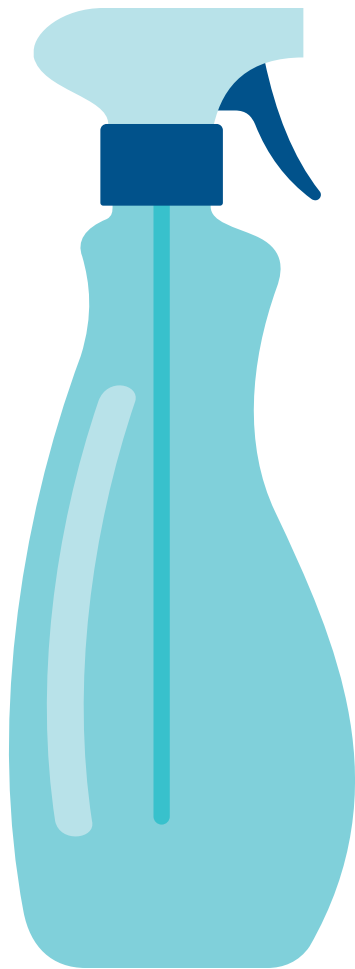
Gasoline makes our cars go. Gas also gives off fumes. Breathing gas fumes can hurt our head, eyes and nose.



Play it safe. Do not touch, taste or smell a cleaning product. Cleaners and soaps that are unsafe for children should be locked away.



Plants and flowers outside look pretty, but some can make you sick. It's hard to tell which are poisonous and which are not, so it's best not to touch.



Many cleaning products in your home are made of poisonous chemicals. Stay safe. Do not touch, taste or smell a cleaning product.



A garage or workshop should never be used as a play area. Ask an adult to get out art supplies that are just for you.



Many fertilizers are made of harmful chemicals. Natural fertilizers are better for animals, the planet and you!



We use sprays to help our lawns and gardens grow. Touching these sprays can make you sick. Wash your hands after playing outside!



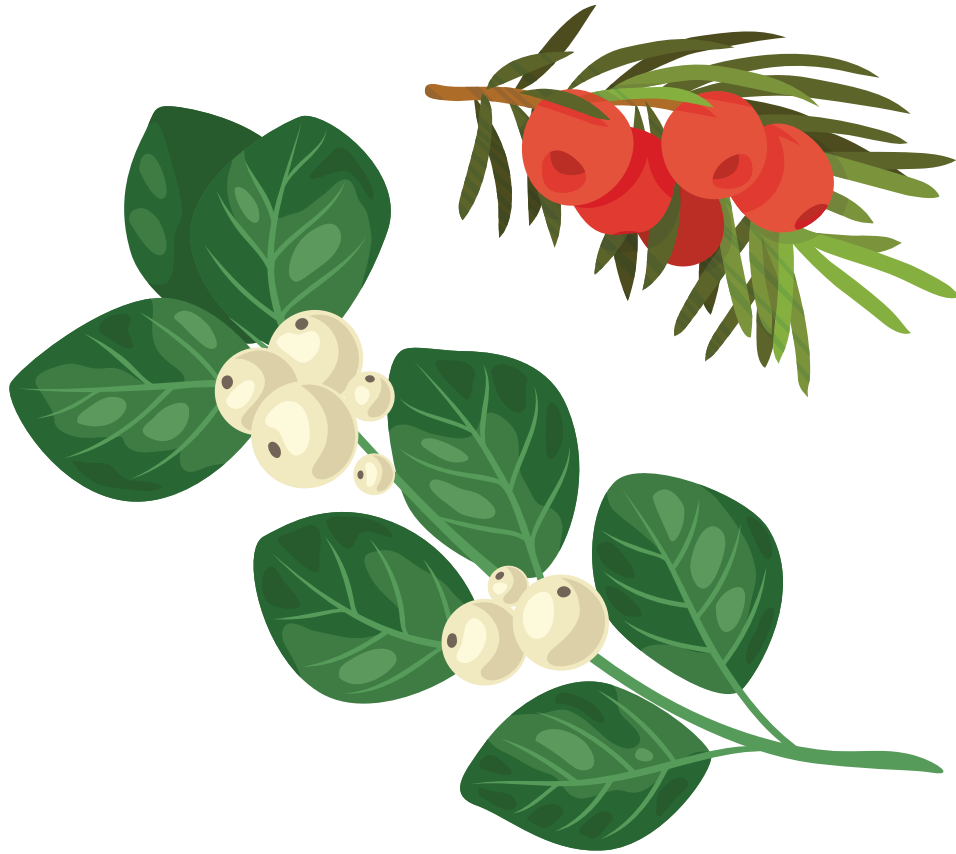
Be smart about poisons. Store cleaning supplies out of reach so younger kids can't get to them.



Grills can be very hot, even when the food is done cooking. Stay safe. Do not touch a grill or play near a grill.



Keep dangerous cleaners out of reach from children! Bleach can hurt your skin, eyes and nose.



Berries growing on bushes and trees might look delicious, but some berries can make you very sick. Always ask an adult before you eat anything growing outside.



Nail polish colors and bottles are pretty, but nail polish has chemicals in it. Stay safe. Ask a grown-up to paint your nails.



It can be hard to tell the difference between poison and candy. Laundry pods are poisonous to kids and pets.



There are many beers and alcoholic drinks that look like sodas and fruit juices. Have a grown-up help you find the right one.



The leaves of some houseplants are poisonous. Eating them can hurt kids and pets.
